There were a few minor recommendations; in general, the audit went well and we are in compliance with the rules and guidelines.
- Merin Noonan and Dianne Murata presented the Grant Committee Report. (See attached Grant Purchase Tracking Spreadsheet). Grant Committee seeks to fund long term needs including equipment for various groups across campus; seeks to fill gaps that are not otherwise covered in the school budget.
